Organisation Background

Budleigh Salterton Town Council recently restructured its climate approach, simplifying a previously broad and complex Climate Action Plan. Their new focus starts internally—assessing the Council's own operations to build a more realistic and impactful route to net zero. The Council's Climate Action Committee, while enthusiastic, lacks specific technical expertise. Their main priority is to undertake an initial carbon/energy audit to establish a clear emissions baseline.

Plans For Growing Your Organisation/ Reaching Net Zero

- The Council aims to identify and act on internal emissions through simple, achievable steps.
- There's a strong desire to gain clarity on carbon impact before setting further policy.
- The Council also sees value in acting as a local role model and sharing its sustainability journey with the wider community.

- 1 Complete an internal carbon/energy audit to establish baseline emissions.
- 2 Build councillor and staff understanding around carbon scopes and action planning.

- 4 Consider adopting a public-facing commitment such as the SME Climate Hub pledge.
