Landscape Recovery in the Otter Valley

In September 2023, *Clinton Devon Estates* plans to submit a Landscape Recovery proposal to Defra for funding under the government's new Environmental Land management Schemes (ELMS). <u>Landscape Recovery: round two - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>. Since Brexit, ELMS is the primary route for government to support environmental enhancement in farmed landscapes. Landscape Recovery projects will contribute to national priorities including net zero, biodiversity and water quality.

The application process is competitive, and projects must demonstrate environmental and social enhancement. The project area covers the lower Otter catchment, mostly south of Newton Poppleford, although boundaries have yet to be tightly defined (subject to consultation). It is anticipated to fall within the larger area highlighted in Map 1.

The proposal aims to develop a detailed, fundable proposition restoring and connecting wildlife habitats across ca. 5,000 hectares of the lower Otter catchment. This multi-functional landscape will also meet the needs for food, timber, clean water and access alongside the mitigation of climate change effects such as flooding. The initiative is framed by the concept of a 'super National Nature Reserve' (NNR) and is strengthened by the recent declaration of the Pebblebed Heaths NNR and the Lower Otter Restoration Project (LORP).

If the application for initial seed funding is successful, the development phase (over 24 months, 2024-26) would review existing habitat and landscape connectivity across the catchment and provide a blueprint for how this can be improved. Sustainable food production and making progress towards achieving East Devon's net zero carbon ambitions through carbon storage will also be central parts of this scheme.

In addition, long-term solutions to maintain public access would be developed and costed. This will include those footpaths alongside the River Otter where public access and existing health and wellbeing benefits are currently threatened by erosion. The potential for new woodland creation and providing enhanced access through the wider landscape would also be assessed.


From autumn 2023 a stakeholder group will be established to help steer the development phase. This will include representatives from local government, local parish councils, land managers and a range of private and environmental organisations with an interest in the landscape and the environmental, societal and economic benefits it supports. Stakeholders will be involved in shaping priorities for the landscape plan to ensure it has broad support.

Our vision is that by working together this initiative will: 1) deliver an accessible, nature-rich landscape that is resilient to climate change, 2) support East Devon's net zero and food production ambitions, and 3) drive a stronger, greener and more sustainable economy.

Should our application for a pilot Landscape Recovery scheme be unsuccessful we will necessarily scale down our short-term ambition but continue to develop a common vision for the catchment through wide stakeholder engagement and seek opportunities for enhancement as circumstances arise.
